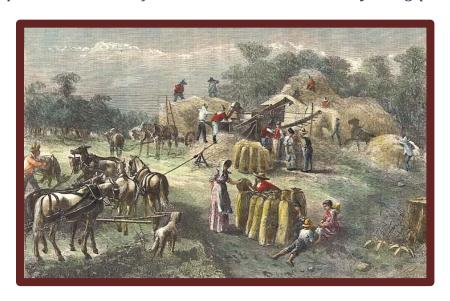


PLATE 34: William H. Rogers (after O. C. Steinberger), *Harvest Time in the West Harper's Weekly* (September 21, 1878)

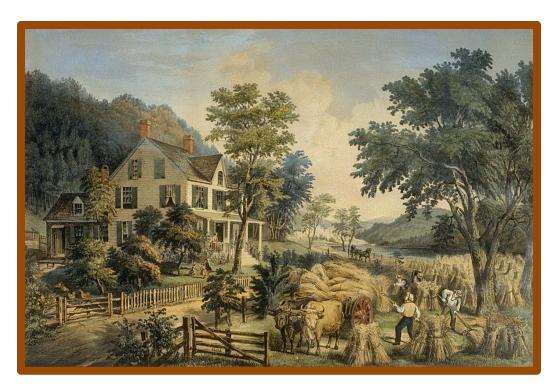

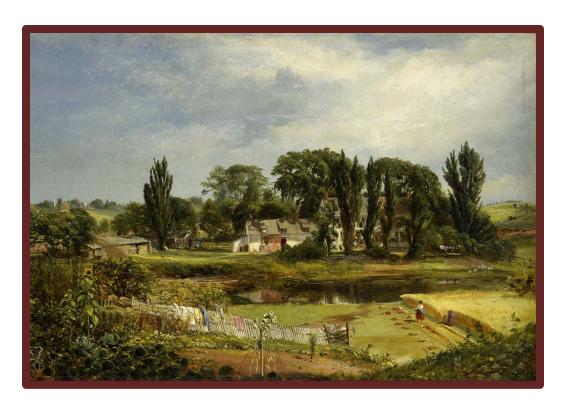

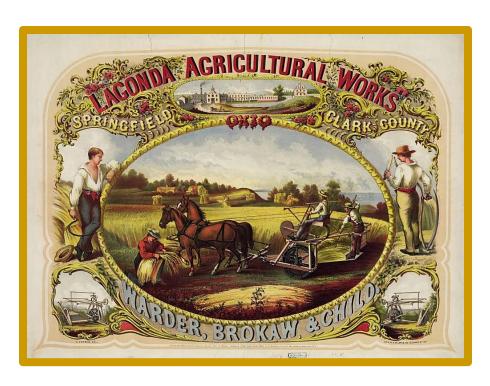


PLATE 40. Elisha Forbes, *Lagonda Agricultural Works Reaper* Poster (1859)

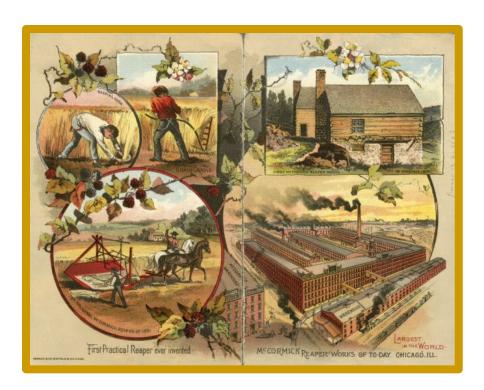


PLATE 41. McCormick Reaper Works Promotional Card (1886) Prints and Photographs Division, Library of Congress

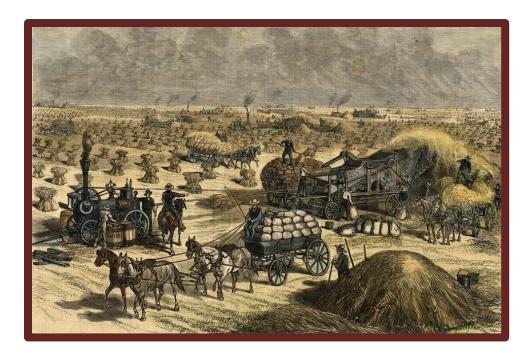
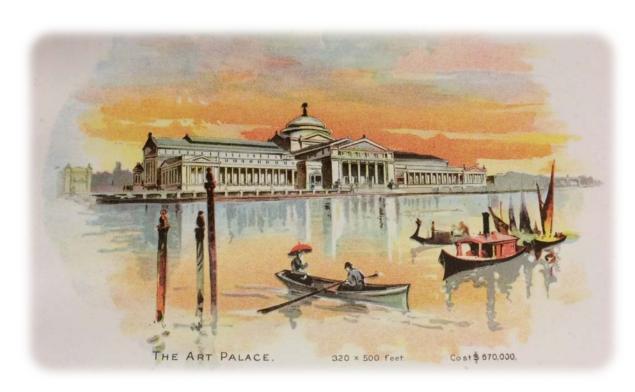

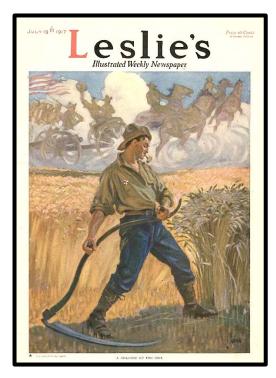

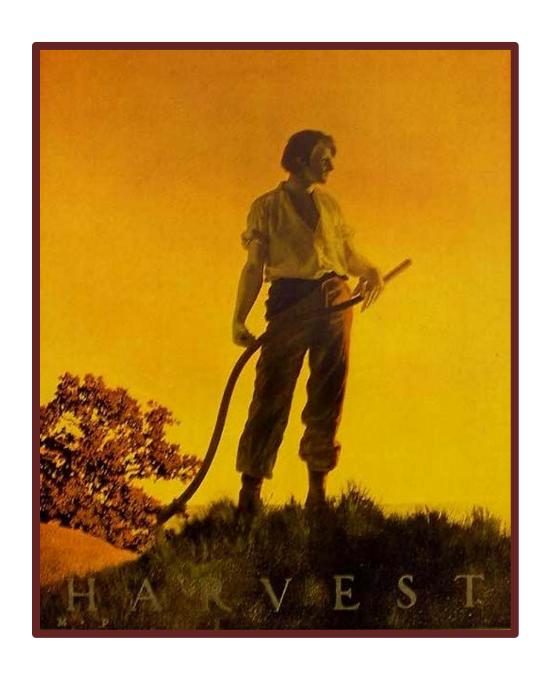


PLATE 54: Maxfield Parrish, *Harvest Collier's Magazine* (September 24, 1905)

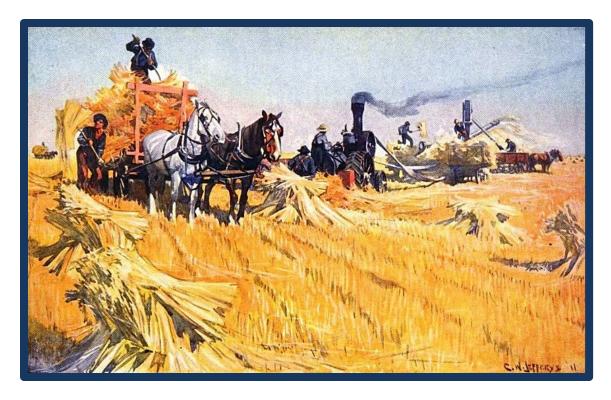

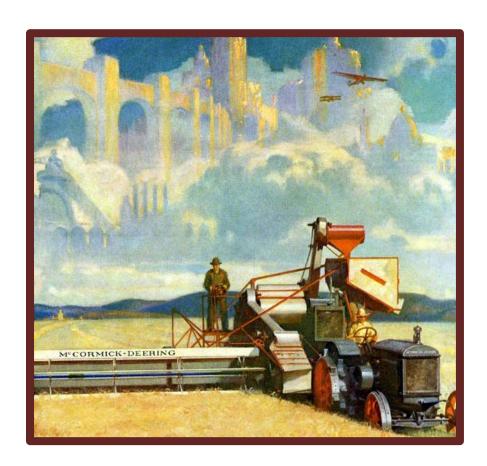


PLATE 59: Phillip Lyford, *The McCormick-Deering Harvester-Thresher The Country Gentleman* (May, 1931)

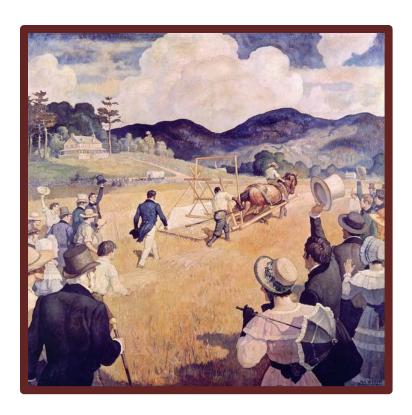


PLATE 60: N. C. Wyeth, *The World's First Reaper* [1831] *The Country Gentleman Magazine* (April, 1931)

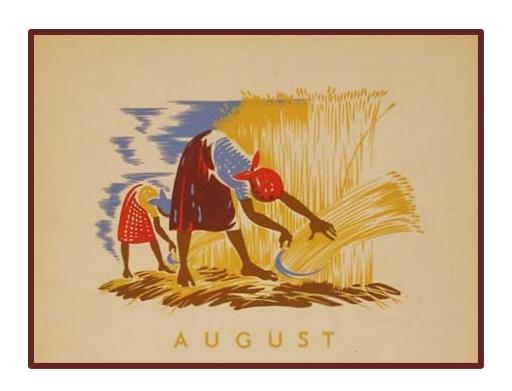

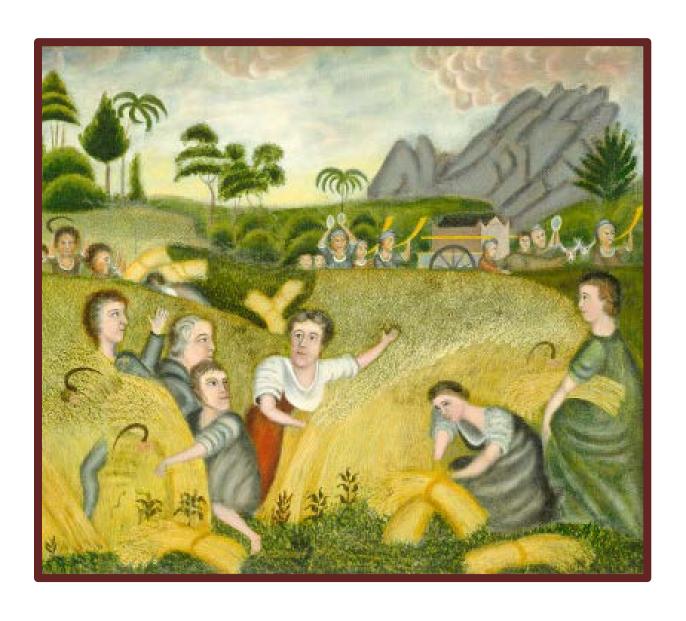
